Today we welcome you to the 25th Annual NIJC Human Rights Awards, a milestone that not only coincides with the 40th anniversary of NIJC's founding, but also just over one month since NIJC became an independent, nonprofit organization.

We are excited for this opportunity to celebrate NIJC's legacy and renew our collective commitment to continuing our mission to uphold justice for immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers.

NIJC was founded in 1984 by a group of Chicagoans who recognized the need for immigration legal services for migrants arriving to the city from Central America and Haiti. Originally known as the Midwest Immigrant Rights Center, the organization served about 82 people in its first year through a mostly volunteer network of 60 attorneys. Since those early years, NIJC has expanded into a nationally recognized leader in immigrant rights with offices in Chicago; Goshen and Indianapolis, Indiana; San Diego; and Washington, D.C. Today, NIJC has a staff of more than 160 professionals and a network of about 2,000 pro bono attorneys. Last year, we provided legal services for more than 12,000 people, and we expect that number to remain high as the need to defend access to justice becomes ever more urgent. NIJC staff and pro bono attorneys also continue to be on the vanguard of federal impact litigation and policy advocacy, striving to set positive precedents for people seeking protection within our borders and holding the federal government accountable for upholding human rights and due process for all immigrants.

Immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers face growing obstacles to justice in the United States. NIJC's courageous clients, expert staff, and invaluable network of legal advocates and volunteers have shown that achieving justice is possible, and necessary. The stories you hear today offer a small glimpse of the greater good we can accomplish when we join together with a shared mission of justice.

We are so grateful you are part of NIJC's story. My hope is that you will help us write the next chapter by participating in today's paddle raise. Our goal is to raise \$200,000 in honor of the NIJC Human Rights Awards' 25th anniversary, and we cannot achieve this milestone without your generous support.







Edwidge Danticat

Edwidge Danticat is the author of several books, including Breath, Eyes, Memory, an Oprah Book Club selection, Krik? Krak!, a National Book Award finalist, The Farming of Bones, an American Book Award winner; the novels-in-stories, The Dew Breaker, Claire of the Sea Light, and The Art of Death, a National Book Critics Circle finalist for Criticism. She has written seven books for children and young adults, a travel narrative, After the Dance, and a collection of essays, Create Dangerously. Her memoir, Brother, I'm Dying, was a 2007 finalist for the National Book Award and a 2008 winner of the National Book Critics Circle Award for autobiography. She is the editor of The Butterfly's Way: Voices from the Haitian Dyaspora in the United States, The Beacon Best of 2000, Haiti Noir, Haiti Noir 2, and Best American Essays 2011. She is a 2009 MacArthur Fellow, a 2018 Ford Foundation Art of Change Fellow, a 2018 winner of the Neustadt Prize, a 2019 winner of the Saint Louis Literary Award. a 2020 United States Artist Fellow, a 2020 winner of the Vilceck Prize, and a 2023 winner of the PEN/Malamud Award for Excellence in the Short Story. Her story collection, Everything Inside, was a 2020 winner of the Bocas Fiction Prize, The Story Prize, and the National Book Critics Circle Fiction Prize. She is a Member of the New York Writer's Hall of Fame and The American Academy of Arts and Letters. She is currently teaching at Columbia University.

Brian Casey is a partner in the Litigation Department of Barnes & Thornburg's South Bend, Indiana, office. His practice focuses on business litigation, particularly class action, ERISA, and appellate litigation. Since joining NIJC as a volunteer attorney at its first Indiana Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) clinic in 2012, Mr. Casey has argued and secured positive outcomes in

two cases at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, filed two federal habeas claims to advocate for an asylum-seeker's release from ICE detention, and secured asylum for a Central American family. Currently, he represents an immigrant youth in a case that recently was added to NIJC's federal lawsuit involving delays in the adjudication of bona fide determinations for U visa applicants and represents another client seeking withholding of removal.

COMMUNITY CHANGE AWARD

Latino Policy Forum

The Latino Policy Forum was founded in 2009 with the mission to build the power, influence, and leadership of the Latino community. Through advocacy and analysis, the Forum pursues public policy that promotes equity and justice for the more than 2 million Latinos in Illinois in the areas of education, immigration, housing, and leadership. In 2022, seeing the need for a coordinated response to the arrival of migrants in Chicago and the state from the Texas-Mexico border, the Forum convened the Welcome to Illinois Coalition, which brings together community, organizational, government, and philanthropic leaders to exchange information and resources and provide compassionate, holistic, and culturally competent support for new arrivals. The National Immigrant Justice Center has been an invaluable member of the coalition, providing legal expertise and services to migrants.

PRESENTERS & SPEAKERS

MONSERRAT ARREOLA

Monserrat Arreola arrived in the United States with her family when she was three years old and settled in the Chicago suburbs. As a survivor of domestic violence who has experienced first-hand the trauma of long-term incarceration, she has become a mentor and an advocate for the rights of immigrant victims of violence. In 2023 she testified before a Federal Communications Commission hearing that has resulted in new federal regulations requiring jails to make phone calls more accessible to people in immigration detention. She now works at Organized Communities Against Deportation, where she assists in fundraising efforts such as grant writing, and coordinates Know Your Rights workshops for newly arrived migrants.

MARY MEG MCCARTHY

Mary Meg McCarthy is NIJC's executive director. Under her leadership, NIJC has grown from a \$1 million to a \$16 million organization with 160 staff and a network of over 2,000 pro bono attorneys and volunteers in five offices throughout the United States. Through its unique approach integrating advocacy, impact litigation, legal counsel, and public education, NIJC has responded to the everchanging immigration environment. Mary Meg is an internationally recognized immigration law expert who has testified before Congress and at the United Nations and is frequently quoted in major news outlets including The New York Times, The Washington Post, and CNN. Her honors include the Justice John Paul Stevens Award from the Chicago Bar Association, the Chicago Inn of Court 2015 Don Hubert Public Service Award, the Pax Christi 2013 Teacher of Peace Award, the Federal Bar Association Chicago Chapter 2021 Kathryn Smith Matkov Award, the Damen Award from Loyola University Chicago, and the Dr. Thomas J. Dooley Award from the University of Notre Dame Alumni Association. In June 2018, she received an honorary degree in law from Knox College (Galesburg, IL).

ADA MEJIA HERNANDEZ

Ada Mejia Hernandez recently won asylum protection following a clinic organized by awardee Brian Casey of Barnes & Thornburg LLP in Indiana.

Abiman Rajadurai is senior counsel, global labor & employment law, at McDonald's Corporation, and serves as general counsel for McDonald's Operating Company. He actively participates on the legal department's probono and DEI committees. Abiman is a long-time NIJC pro bono attorney. He is a member of NIJC's Leadership Board and co-chairs the Human Rights Awards Committee.

JOSUÉ SAINT-JEAN

Josué Saint-Jean was a well-known radio journalist in Haiti until he learned his name had been placed on a death list by political gangs in Port-au-Prince. He and his wife fled to the United States, and soon afterward welcomed their first child. They have since become U.S. citizens and are raising two daughters near Chicago, where he works as a food safety manager for a grocery store chain.

JOHN M. SKAKUN III
